LANCING AND SOMPTING CORONAVIRUS COMMUNITY SUPPORT GROUP

The Lancing and Sompting Coronavirus Community Support Group was created on Facebook on 15th March 2020 - just over a week before the lockdown. As a result, the local community stepped forward and over 200 offered their time to volunteer to help others, including those who had been furloughed, enabling them to offer the extra time they now had to support the community. The group has around 1,200 members, most of

whom live in the Lancing and Sompting area and are able to offer help when needed or notify us if someone is in need of help.



Our volunteers delivered, where possible, as many leaflets as they could, before the lockdown, to let the community know that we were here to help. They also liaised with pharmacies and surgeries in order to help them and distributed posters around various shops and businesses.

We have a core pool of volunteers who act as co-ordinators for their hyper -local teams, who carry out various tasks such as collecting and delivering

prescriptions, helping with shopping, a friendly check in and chat and various forms of advice where needed. They've even set up two jigsaw libraries to help those who have been self-isolating.

Two of our volunteers with access to motorbikes are able to cover the whole area and help to collect and deliver prescriptions and shopping etc., often several times a day. One has also been helping to get shopping for residents across a number of residential homes, whilst the other has also been delivering clinical samples for processing for the NHS and even helped one older isolating couple obtain medication for their ageing dog.



We have been supporting local businesses by recommending those who through tele-

phone ordering, are able to supply the community with essentials, which our volunteers can then collect and deliver.

We have also been working alongside Adur and Worthing Councils through their volunteer scheme, and have had a substantial number of referrals from them for people needing ongoing help and support.

Many of us have never met, but through social media we have been able to create this wonderful support group and at present, great virtual friendships, which no doubt will become reality once all this ends.

Even though the lockdown is easing, we will continue to support the local community and when the pandemic comes to an end, we will still continue to do so. The pandemic may have created the group, but it won't end it - our wonderful community has shown a true spirit of coming together, and that will continue for years to come.

HALEWICK LANE

A public consultation concerning the demolition of the Waste Management Site at Halewick Lane had to be abandoned because of Covid19 restrictions. A meeting was held on 27th May 2020 using digital communication. We were delighted to welcome Tom Coates from WSCC, who explained that Planning Permission had now been granted for a battery storage plant and that the project would be going ahead very soon. This is likely to cause some disruption to residents, but the good news is that issues with road ownership and maintenance of gulleys and lagoons have been resolved. Sompting Parish Councillors had many questions for Mr Coates. Further questions from Councillors will be put in writing to WSCC and residents are invited to put their concerns in writing either to Mr Coates at WSCC or submit them via Carol Stephenson, our Parish Clerk, at Harriet Johnson Centre, Loose Lane, Sompting BN15 OBG.




Despite lockdown, some progress has been made at the meadow, courtesy of our Conservation Officer, Leighton Clay, with the introduction of Hope, Epic and Meadow, three hungry sheep who are making short work of the brambles and overgrown areas. The clearance of these areas will lend itself

to autumn planting and plans are being considered on how future public sessions can be managed with social distancing in place. Apart from a few minor incidents, the sheep have taken well to living in a public space and the public are enjoying their presence with daily visitors to this beautiful place. Many thanks to our project's lead resident, Steve Willeter who has been keeping an eye on them and is always willing to help. Thanks also to ClIr Tony Nicklen, who has supported Leighton with moving the ladies from one strip to another and to members of the community, who have undertaken to keep the animals well watered during this hot weather. With the help of ClIr Richard Aulton, ClIr Cathy Glynn-Davies, Steve Willeter and Leighton we have also achieved some spring planting of a variety of trees such which are all doing well. Special thanks to Mr and Mrs Bigg who have very kindly agreed to match fund an additional bench at Malthouse Meadow. Sompting Parish Council will fund the difference. Do visit soon. It's a lovely place to walk and enjoy.

Lancing and Sompting Foodbank

We have been providing the services of a foodbank in the two villages for the last 9 years but the last two months have been so different. In normal times



In addition the way we are helping has changed. To support the social distancing rules we have offered many people Food Vouchers from the Co-op or ASDA and more recently vouchers for meat and fresh fruit and vegetables from Dave Brown Butchers shop in Lancing. Thus fewer people have come to our distribution centres and the total amount of actual food has reduced by about 40%. We have kept in touch with people we know with ongoing needs when we have had donations of fresh food to distribute. Electric Storm Youth have provided a delivery system for us each week and the Coronavirus Community group has been a useful backup.

Sompting Parish Council have been very supportive in providing space at the Harriet Johnson Centre for storage of emergency food bags and a collection point for donations from Sompting people. They have also provided a substantial financial grant which was matched by the Sompting Big Local Hub which made a huge difference to our ability to buy food vouchers for our visitors. Individuals have also given us significant donations.

We have developed a list of organisations to which we can signpost people with additional problems which we have shared with other local foodbanks in the new network of food support organisations. We have achieved this with a small band of 10 volunteers supported by others from Lancing and Sompting Lions, the local churches and many individuals who collect food for us. We have tried to prevent person to person contact to reduce spread of the infection.

It is very difficult to predict how the future will look as the withdrawal of Government business subsidies kicks in. We forsee additional redundancies ahead and if social restriction continues that the need for our services will remain high for months to come. We have learned how to be resilient and change patterns of work with changing regulations and feel confident we can continue to support our need households, believing that the local community will continue to support us in what we do.
